Taiwan as a Hot Spot in the Geopolitics of the Anthropocene

Paul Jobin, PhD, is Associate Research Professor at the Institute of Sociology, Academia Sinica, Taiwan. Previous to that position, he was Associate Professor in the department of Asian studies at the University of Paris Diderot and Director of the French Centre for Research on Contemporary China (CEFC) in Taiwan. His research focuses on issues of environmental justice in Asia, in particular in Taiwan and Japan. Among his recent publications is a co-edited volume on *Environmental Movements and Politics in the Asian Anthropocene* (Singapore: ISEAS, 2021) and several journal articles such as "Our 'good neighbor' Formosa Plastics" (*Environmental Sociology*, 2021). This lecture will posit that the man-made ecological epoch called the Anthropocene is necessarily a matter of geopolitics. It will then show how Taiwan is located both on the front line of the defense of democracy and climate (and biodiversity) emergency. The case of Taiwan highlights how traditional geopolitics (national sovereignties and military warfare) and the new approach to geopolitics focusing on ecological concerns are entangled with one another. The question is thus: how to address the two sides efficiently, how to maintain vulnerable national sovereignties without giving up on the front of ecology?
